1 Santa Cruz, California 2 Friday, May 13, 2016 3 4 MR. LEN HARTKEMEIER: (4:36 p.m.) 5 Len Hartkemeier, and I am mainly here about the 6 41 and 42 bus lines. I use the 41 regularly, and I 7 think as much service has to be maintained as can be. The principle information I want to deliver in this 8 9 testimony is that the 3:30 in the afternoon run, 41, is 10 virtually always full, oftentimes, five or six bicycles, 11 UC Santa Cruz students, high school students going home, 12 teachers from the Bay View Elementary, a whole 13 collection of retired and business people. 14 So I think it's a very important run to be able 15 to return people and not have to wait until the end of the afternoon. 16 17 I would love to see the second bus in the 18 morning be maintained, but I know that its occupancy is 19 not high. So I think it would be good to keep those 41 20 and 42 buses as good ways of breaking up one's day and 21 not having to stay the entire day in Santa Cruz. 22 The other thing I wanted to say is there are a 23 number of people, both Santa Cruz students and teachers, 24 who only have one or two classes a day and would like to 25 be able to get home and not kill an entire day. So they

1	would like to see a midday run, 12:30 or 1:00, something
2	like that, that allowed them to get home after they had
3	done their classes or a little bit of shopping and not
4	have to wait until 3:30.
5	That's about all I have to say.
6	(End of comments.)
7	WENDELL COTTON: (4:38 p.m.) I'm Wendell
8	Cotton, and I haven't ridden the bus for a couple of
9	years now, but there were times when I would take the
10	bus down in the morning, 41, to take the Palo Alto VA
11	maintains a bus line for veterans that probably
12	originates somewhere, but one of the stops is the
13	Veterans Memorial Building or right across the street
14	from it, about 9:40 in the morning. I can make that
15	okay. But on the way home, it stops again in the
16	afternoon to where if I try to get to the Metro station
17	to catch the 41, I miss it by seconds. And it was very
18	frustrating, because I was literally jogging to get to
19	the Metro station from down where the Veterans Memorial
20	Building is, and I'm sure there is enough veterans
21	around that would appreciate being able to make a Metro
22	bus connection. And then if you miss it, then you have
23	to wait for the second bus. That may not be a problem
24	here in the future, but that would be my that is my
25	main concern is if I wanted to take the bus over to Palo

1 Alto VA, I would have to wait rather than catching the 2 bus that is immediately leaving, and there doesn't seem 3 to be any coordination there. Maybe if, you know, if it 4 stayed just five minutes later, I would have been able 5 to catch the bus and do it without running and, you 6 know. 7 So that's my major point and comment. I think with the proposed changes that might not be an issue 8 9 anymore. But if they still maintained two lines or two 10 41 lines in the afternoon, that would be a concern with 11 me. 12 (End of comments.) 13 MR. JOEL KUBBY: (5:18 p.m.) Joel Kubby. So 14 I'm here to discuss the proposed service reduction. Ι 15 ride the 41, and I've been riding it since 2008, and I 16 commute to UC Santa Cruz, so I take the 8:30 a.m. run, 17 and I come home on the 5:30 p.m. run. Both of those are 18 planned to be cut. So they are going to change the 41 19 down to one trip a day at 5:50 a.m. 20 So what I'd like to know is how they came up 21 with those times, because they wouldn't work for me, and 22 they also wouldn't work for the Santa Cruz High School 23 students. The Santa Cruz High School students get out, 24 the fourth period class at 3:15 p.m., and they are 25 proposing that they take the 2:30 p.m. 42 bus. They

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1 don't go in to school until 8:00 a.m. and the 5:50 -- if 2 they took the 5:50 a.m. bus to get into school, they 3 will be waiting an hour before class.

4 So my proposal is to average the times. So 5 right now, 41 -- I'd like to keep the service, in 6 general, but that is probably not going to happen. So 7 they have got a bus leaving at 5:50 a.m. and 8:00 a.m., 8 so basically six and eight, so I'd say make that one 9 leave at seven and then you have got one leaving in the 10 afternoon at 3:30 and 5:30, so make that one 4:30.

11 So average the two times and keep the service, 12 instead of one trip, two trips. So then the high school 13 students would be able to take it and the middle school 14 students, they also -- middle school starts at 8:00 a.m. 15 The Mission people, their's start at 8:00 a.m. So they 16 are going to wait around an hour for class to start if 17 they take the 5:50 bus. So their proposals don't work 18 for me and I don't think they make sense to the people 19 who they say they are trying to serve, Bonny Doon and 20 Santa Cruz High School.

That's my comment. Oh -- and let's see. I think I would like to see the CEO of the Metro work on fundraising, rather than cutting his way to a balanced budget, I would like to see him go out and solicit funds. The mission of the Santa Cruz Metro is personal

1 mobility and sustainability. They have not received any 2 funding for either of those two causes. I went online 3 and searched for funding for those causes and there is 4 all sorts of California funding for personal mobility 5 and sustainability. 6 So I would like to see the CEO of the Metro go 7 out and raise funding for the mission of the Santa Cruz 8 Metro. (End of comments.) 9 10 MS. LAURA PARKS: (5:23 p.m.) So I'm Laura and 11 I'm Joel's mate, and he just talked, and Joel is a 12 faculty member at UCSC, he failed to mention that. So 13 that is pretty important. He goes in five days a week. 14 There is a bicycle/bus commuter in the interest of 15 sustainability. We'd like to keep that up. What is 16 going to happen, either he will need to take his car all 17 the time or we'll have to figure out a way to get -- in 18 the morning, I could drive him to work every morning and 19 then he could take the bus home maybe -- oh, you can't 20 do that with the current plan. Never mind. I would 21 have to take him to work and pick him up, too. So it's 22 going to affect my lifestyle, too. And one more car on 23 the road and there are a lot of accidents. Yeah. We 24 don't need more cars. Okay. 25 (End of comments.)

1 MS. SINGNE COE: (5:37 p.m.) Singne Coe is my 2 name, and I live in Bonny Doon. I was thinking that if 3 we had maybe just one route, but it made a circle to 4 Davenport, up to Bonny Doon and down to Santa Cruz, that 5 would eliminate the need for two up-and-back type 6 So if, say in the morning, the bus could pick routes. 7 up school kids, went to Davenport, then up to Bonny 8 Doon, up to Pine Flat or Empire Grade and down the 9 mountain, that would just be one back-and-forth bus trip 10 and maybe that would allow for more bus trips of that 11 nature. So instead of up and back twice, circle routes. 12 So perhaps that way there could be a later run in the 13 morning to not only -- there could be a run in the early 14 morning to pick up students for school that would make a 15 circle. Then there would be another run that would be 16 possible a little later in the morning for people who go to work or need to go do errands downtown or something 17 18 like that at a later hour. So that would allow two 19 trips in the morning instead of one. Then maybe even if 20 the route were always that circle route, maybe that would allow even for a further route, for the same cost 21 22 that is projected on the schedule. 23 (End of comments.) 24 MS. DEBORAH SMITH: (6:42 p.m.) Deborah Smith, 25 and I want an evening commute ride home. The 5:30 bus

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1	is what I take now, Number 41, and an 8:30 replacement
2	would be too late to hang out for three and a half hours
3	after work, so I would like something closer to
4	6:00 p.m., 6:30.
5	That's it.
6	(End of comments.)
7	MS. MICAELA MUSSELL: (6:55) The main thing I
8	want is the 5:30 bus, because when I go to school and
9	when I'm coming back, a lot of my classes tend to end
10	around 2:30 or 3:00 and I can't get back to the Metro in
11	time for the 3:30 bus, which is being proposed for like
12	the only one. Other than the really late one. So if
13	the 5:30 bus is there I can at least get home, not like
14	at 9:30 or 10:00, or really, really late, because the
15	only bus in the morning would be at about 8:00 or 8:30,
16	so that would be like a 13-hour day, which I would
17	prefer not to have to be in town for an extra four
18	hours, if possible. So the 5:30 bus is the main thing
19	that I really want to have back or to have added later
20	at some point.
21	Other than that, I think the morning bus they
22	are imposing is fine. Even though I'm used to another
23	bus being later, I understand that they have to cut
24	things and I can still take the earlier bus, so the main
25	thing I just want is the 5:30 bus to definitely happen,

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1 if possible. And that's about it.

3 MS. RACHEL GOODMAN: (6:57) My name is Rachel 4 Goodman, and I've been living here for 22 years in Bonny 5 I have two grandchildren, one of whom you just Doon. 6 spoke to, who goes to Cabrillo, but the whole time I've 7 been in Bonny Doon since my children were in high 8 school, the first one, which has been about 10 years or 9 11, they have always taken the bus to go to school, and 10 I realize living in a rural area, we won't get the kind 11 of service city folks get, but there are working folks 12 here and when our cars break down, we are really stuck. 13 So I would like to have a 5:30 bus for the working 14 people here, I have people I know who go to work in the 15 morning and they come home at 5:00, and so it's going to 16 be a handicap for them to stay another three hours in There have been times that I have had no car and 17 town. 18 I felt very isolated here and have to wait in town for 19 So the 5:30 bus would help. hours.

The other comment I want to make is weekends. I understand why you have to make cuts, but have any more possible service on weekends will help young people who do not drive. One of the biggest issues here are dangerous drivers and lots of cars on the road, so clearly for us, every car that does not get on the road

1	like for anomale we dependence is sonaidening setting a
	like, for example, my daughter is considering getting a
2	car because of this cut. And if she has enough service
3	she won't buy one and there is one less car and perhaps
4	one less accident on the road. It's more a plea for the
5	planet also our way of life here not being so car
б	dependent that we have no other choice. We don't have
7	horses some people do, but they don't ride them to
8	town. Thank you.
